(Japanische Romantische Straße)

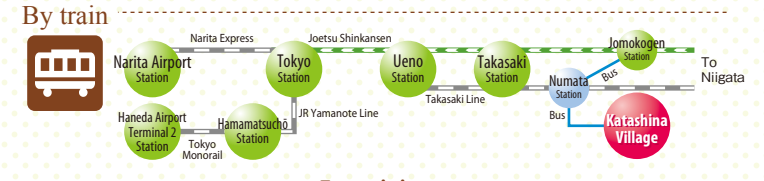
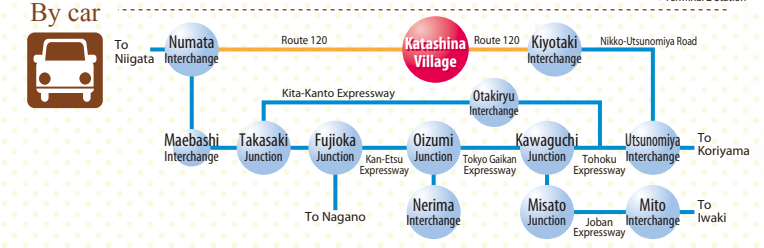
This road covers 320km in total, from Ueda City to Karuzawa in Nagano, then Kusatsu, Numata City and Katashina Village in Gunma, then to Nikko City in Tochigi. A great many romantic poets in Japan have written about this road, and from the fact that its views are the most similar in Japan to German landscapes, it was renamed in the style of the Romantic Road in Germany. It has been a sister road to the German Romantic Road since November 1988.

special protection area, and a special national treasure and is specified under the Ramsar Convention. It is home to alpine flora such as *mizubasho* flowers, as sung in the well-known song "Natsu no Omoide", and *nikkokisuge* flowers (broad dwarf day-lilies) that fill the wetland with vivid yellow, autumn plants that dye the whole wetland with a golden color, and floating islands rocked by the ponds; its majestic scenery draws the eyes of all.
